Chávez Foundation. There will be a light dinner and live mariachi music. After the reception, the public is invited to an art walk and the viewing of "Soy Americano: Contemporary Chicana/o Political and Civic Art," the first art show of the 2008-09 visual-exhibition season at EMCC.

The exhibition features contemporary Latino artists who are commenting on civic and political issues. It is sponsored by the Arizona State University Hispanic Research Center. "Soy Americano" will be in Estrella and Komatke halls until Nov. 3.
