GLENDALE - A gunshot into a home Saturday left one man dead.

The shooting happened around 4:30 a.m. in the 6700 block of 54th Drive. Police said someone from outside the home fired a shot into the residence, killing Julian Amarillas, 36.

Police are seeking any witnesses.
