Avondale offers winter break camps

The Avondale Recreation Division is offering programs to keep children occupied during winter break.

Camp P.L.A.Y programs are open for chilren ages 5 to 12 and are offered Monday through Thursday for the weeks of Dec. 21 and Dec. 28.

Youths can be registered for separate 1.5 hour programs such as Winter Warm Up - Sports and Games, Creative Freeze - Arts and Crafts, Snow Days Science or Club E.L.F. (Enrichment with Literature and Film).

There is also the option to register for them all to have a full day camp experience.

Cost for each Camp P.L.A.Y Winter Break Camp class is \$20 per week for Avondale residents; \$25 per week for non-Avondale residents.

Registration after Dec. 12 is subject to a late registration fee of an additional \$5 per course. If your child registers for the entire day, he or she will be asked to bring a sack lunch, as lunch is not provided as part of the program.

Program dates and times are designed to give parents a chance to get last minute shopping done and get ready for the holidays.

Different classes are offered during each week of camp. The following times and sessions are available:

Winter Warm Up - Sports and Games Camp: 8 a.m. to 9:30 a.m.

Creative Freeze - Arts and Crafts Camp: 9:45a.m to 11:15 a.m.

Snow Days Science Camp: 12:30 p.m. to 2 p.m.

Club E.L.F. (Enrichment with Literature and Film): 2:15 p.m. to 4 p.m.

Avondale Camp P.L.A.Y Winter Break Camp is hosted at Avondale City Hall.

Public input requested for General Plan 2030 Avondale wants your input for its General Plan 2030 update. The General Plan is a comprehensive, long-range statement of goals and related policies that guides physical, economic, and environmental growth and revitalization of a city.

It acts as a blueprint for future growth and development by guiding the city's day-to-day decision-making for land use and city services.

Municipalities are required by the state legislature under the Smart Growth Plus legislation to update their General Plans every 10 years. However, updating a General Plan does more than just meet legal requirements. It is a statement of a community's values, and a vision for Avondale's future growth and evolution.

In Avondale, the community, state agencies, and city staff will help guide the planning process through a series of stakeholder meetings.

There is an option to also take the survey in person by visiting an Avondale library for a paper copy.

Fighter Country Partnership receives grant

Fighter Country Partnership, an advocacy group for Luke Air Force Base, was selected to receive grant funding from the Tohono O'odham Nation.

It was awarded \$55,000 to provide assistance to the Luke Airman's Fund, expand the community education program for the base and provide critical information technology upgrades.

The decision issued by the Tohono O'odham Nation came Sept. 14 and is part of its revenue sharing agreement with the state, in which it provides direct support to dozens of local governments and community programs each year.

Fighter Country helped launch the Luke Forward campaign last month to create awareness about Luke Air Force Base's mission to secure the F-35 Joint Strike Fighter.

Almost 10,000 people have already registered their support on the Web site, www.lukeforward.com.
