#### EMCC instructor wins state photo award

Estrella Mountain Community College photography instructor Richard Gross was awarded second prize in a juried digital photography show hosted by Paradise Valley Community College.

The exhibit features artwork by students and members of the community. Only 40 works were chosen from approximately 300 submissions. Judges based their selections on the use of light, composition and the story told by the image.

Gross' photo, titled "Homage to Muqi," is a black-and-white panoramic view of a mountain and sky scene that he constructed from five different photos of torn paper and plastic wrap. The title is a tribute to the Chinese landscapes that were painted during the Song Dynasty as a statement of who the artist was and where he was located.

Gross said he was interested in creating a type of photograph that he hadn't seen before, a trait he hopes to pass on to his students at EMCC.

The digital photography exhibit is available for viewing from noon to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday at the Performing Arts Center at Paradise Valley Community College until Feb. 7.

#### Avondale circulator bus study ends Jan. 31

Residents, businesses owners, students, senior citizens and other potential riders are encouraged to take part in an "Avondale Local Circulator Study," which introduces a new kind of bus transit service to Avondale.

The study will evaluate and use public input to design and assess the feasibility of implementing circulator services in key areas of the city. The survey is available online at www.avondale.org through Jan. 31.

Input collected from public surveys will be used to help determine the transportation needs within Avondale, the areas of the communities to be served, and the most appropriate type of service.

Circulators are community-based, locally oriented bus transit services that bridge the gap between the larger bus routes and residential, commercial, or workplace destinations. They can also be used to travel around the community or between communities. The city is currently studying whether operating a transit circulator, or "community-based shuttle," within Avondale city limits would benefit residents.

## Jerry Kerr named CAP squad commander

Jerry Kerr, 1st Lt. CAP, has assumed the position of squadron commander of the Goodyear 313th Squadron of the Civil Air Patrol.

The 313th Squadron is a component of the U.S. Air Force Auxiliary Civil Air Patrol and is composed of about 30 members dedicated to serving the community, the state, and the country in support of search and rescue, homeland security, communications, reconnaissance, disaster relief, and counter drug operations.

The Squadron meets at 7 p.m. the second and fourth Monday of every month at the Goodyear Police Station on West Van Buren Street in Goodyear.

## Preparedness classes offered in February

Avondale Fire-Rescue's Community Services Division is offering a free series of classes designed to prepare people to handle a variety of emergencies.

From natural disasters such as weather-related events to large scale man-made emergencies, Avondale Fire-Rescue personnel will teach ways to help family, friends and neighbors until professional help can arrive.

The first class is Feb. 25.

C.E.R.T. stands for Community Emergency Response Team and is a national initiative aimed at training members of the community in basic disaster preparedness, first aid, and light search and rescue.

The training series consists of seven sessions on Thursday nights.

A mock disaster drill will be held on the final evening.

Sessions are held from 6 to 10 p.m. at Avondale Fire Station 172, 1825 N. 107th Ave., in Avondale.

Registration is required.

This program is open to both residents and non-residents in the community. Participants must be 18 or older.

Graduates of the course will receive a fully equipped C.E.R.T. preparedness bag, complete with items such as reflective vest, helmet, flashlight, safety glasses, dust mask, and work gloves.
