## Westside celebrates Thanksgiving

Volunteers sought, donations needed, activities abound

For many in the West Valley, giving thanks means giving back.

That's what a group of Tolleson volunteers have been doing for more than a quarter century.

This year commemorates the 28th annual Dr. Charles A. Landis Thanksgiving Day Dinner. The event, sponsored by the Tolleson Service Committee, provides free traditional Thanksgiving meals to all who attend.

"It's a beautiful community event. Everybody gets involved," Tolleson Mayor Adolfo Gamez said.

Last year, more than 1,300 people were fed and more than 1,800 meals were served.

The event is named for Landis, who was superintendent of the Tolleson Union High School District from 1978 to 1992.

"I think we had 500 people come the first year and it just grew," Landis said. "People come together and things come together. The next thing is you're worried about people showing up, but they do. I don't know where they come from, but they show up."

Landis said the event began when it was first suggested that the West Valley needed a St. Vincent de Paul-style Thanksgiving dinner.

"That's when we took the concept and started the Tolleson Thanksgiving dinner," Landis said.

The key to the event's success is its volunteers and donations, Gamez said.

"We get everything donated: the food, the labor, the delivery of the food; the VFW is involved, businesses are involved. It's truly a community event," Gamez said.

Volunteers consist primarily of students from the five campuses in the Tolleson Union High School District. Many of the adult volunteers, especially from the local VFW post, have been part of the annual event for more than 15 years, organizers said.

This year, turkeys have been donated mainly by Crystal Rose Funeral Home, Greer-Wilson Funeral Home and Chase Bank. Everkrisp and Rousseau Farming have provided the vegetables; Holsum Bakery's offered the rolls; and Albertsons is dishing up the pies.

"As far as food items, we're in good shape," Landis said. "But donations are always accepted, and if people want to volunteer, I never turn anybody down."

The Charles Landis Thanksgiving Dinner takes place from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. Thursday at the Tolleson Union High School cafenasium, 9419 W. Van Buren St. Doors are open to everyone.

## More to give

The 13th annual McFeast takes place at 7:30 a.m. Thanksgiving Day at the Estrella Vista Reception Center, 1471 N. Eliseo C. Felix Jr. Way in Avondale.

Volunteers can show up the day of the event, and should arrive by 7 a.m., organizers said.

The event starts with breakfast, which includes a Happy Meal for children. Each child then receives a turkey for their family. The four-hour fest ends with a raffle.

In 2009, McFeast served more than 5,100 people, and handed out 81 new bicycles, 300 backpacks, 3,000 books and helped 231 children in need.

The annual event, which began in 1998 when some 400 people received free meals, is spearheaded by Don Mellon, owner of 18 West Valley McDonald's restaurants; as well as Sharolyn Hohman, president and chief executive officer of the Southwest Valley Chamber of Commerce; David Schwake, food service director for Litchfield Elementary School District; and Cassie Wilkins, director of All Faith Community Outreach Center.

Meanwhile, the American Legion Post 61 in Avondale is still looking for a few good volunteers to help feed Thanksgiving meals to everyone who steps through the organization's doors at 35 N. Dysart Road.

Some 300 guests are expected to show up for a traditional feast of turkey and all the trimmings, Legion officials said. Any underprivileged person is welcome to dine at the Legion hall from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Thanksgiving Day.

Volunteers are needed from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Thursday. To learn more, call 623-932-4960.
