



Goodyear to host 2 electronics-recycling collections

Residents with defunct **computers**, outdated cellphones and other electronic junk can clear some trash piles.

Goodyear is sponsoring two electronics-recycling activities this month to help re-use or refurbish tech clutter.

On Saturday, the Arizona Technology Council Foundation and Westech Recyclers will collect unwanted computers, hard drives, monitors, mice, printers, scanners, cables and cellphones.

The items can be dropped off at the **Lockheed Martin Corp.** campus at 1800 S. Litchfield Road. The collection is free of charge and will be from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Another event will be from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. Jan. 29. The event will be free and is sponsored by the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality. The drop-off site will be at Estrella Mountain Community College near Dysart and Thomas roads.

Computers, monitors, cellphones, telephones, printers, cameras, televisions and DVD players will be accepted. Residents are asked not to bring refrigerators, washers or dryers.

A yearlong drop off is available at the Waste Management White Tanks Transfer Station, 18605 W. McDowell Road.

Goodyear residents can leave **electronic** items for free. The station only accepts items that have circuit boards. Hours of operation are from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. on weekdays and Saturdays and from 7 a.m. to noon.
