

Phoenix woman filming feminism documentary

Central Phoenix resident Olga Tsoudis, a residential-faculty member in sociology at Estrella Mountain Community College, has just been granted a year's sabbatical to make a documentary film on the contemporary feminist movement.

"I'll be interviewing feminists, men and women, of all different backgrounds, races, religions, ages, sexual orientation and ethnicity," Tsoudis said.

The interviews will take place not only in Phoenix and Tucson but NewYork

; Washington, D.C.; Greece; and perhaps India. She has already filmed interviews in Cyprus. The film will be called "Stop Calling Me Girl: Third Wave Feminism in the United States."

Tsoudis, who is taking her second film class at Scottsdale Community College, said the documentary will be available to be shown in classes in the 10 schools in the Maricopa Community Colleges.

This is her second documentary; her first was on the conflict in Cyprus, her husband's native country.

Tsoudis, who received a Ph.D. from the UniversityofArizona, has been at Estrella Mountain in Avondale since fall 2003.
